#### 2022 Saint-Romain Sous Le Château

(91-93)

Drinking Window. 2024 - 2038 Neal Martin, October 2023

The 2022 Saint-Romain Sous Le Château has a very clean and precise, mineral-driven bouquet with lovely fleeting yellow plum and Clementine aromas. The palate is tensile and steely, completely at odds with one's expectation from a warm season, with just a touch of reduction on the lemon verbena-tinged finish. Bon vinl

#### 2022 Saint-Romain Sous Le Velle

The 2022 Saint-Romain Sous Le Velle is comparatively more backward on the nose, a little chalky in style with light Golden Delicious and orange pith scents. There is fine delineation with neatly integrated oak. The palate is well-balanced, with a tang of orange zest on the entry. This has a silver beard of acidity, lending real tension and matching the impressive depth towards the vibrant finish. Sous Le Velle is often one of the go-to vineyards in Saint-Romain, and this proves exactly why.

# 2022 Meursault Les Vignes de Marguerite

The 2022 Meursault Les Vignes de Marguerite comes from the mid-slope of Les Luchets and Les Chevaliers; the vines around 80 years old. It is perhaps the most primal of all Buisson's cuvées at the moment, certainly the most leesy. The palate is a little reductive on the entry, yet there is fine tension and vibrancy, quite steely in style, rending it rather Puligny-like. It will require two or three years in bottle, but it will be worth the wait because it shimmers with freshness and nascent vitality.

### 2022 Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru

The 2022 Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru comes from Le Charlemagne lieu-dit and spent one year used Chassin barrel, then six months in a WineGlobe. The leesy bouquet has hints of white chocolate and chai coming through with time. The palate is medium-bodied with a slightly honeyed opening, quite sapid, with touches of sour lemon and a dab of ginger towards the finish. Quite a "linear" Corton-Charlemagne at the moment.

# 2022 Saint-Romain En Poillange

(90-92)

Color: White

Drinking Window: 2024 - 2036 Neal Martin, October 2023

The 2022 Saint-Romain En Poillange comes from 60 to 70-year-old vines that suffer a lot of millerandage, so it is complanté with new vines and the leaf trellis is raised with no rognage. The complex bouquet combines the terroir expression of Le Jarron with the concentration of Perrière. The palate is well-balanced with a fine bead of acidity counterbalancing the concentration of this Saint-Romain, just a touch of stem ginger elongating the finish. A tip-top Saint-Romain to enjoy over the next decade.

# 2022 Corton Le Rognet-et-Corton Grand Cru

(90-92)

Color: Red

Drinking Window: 2026 - 2041 Neal Martin, October 2023

The 2022 Corton Le Rognet-et-Corton Grand Cru, which includes around 40% whole bunches, has a backward, obdurate nose that refuses to come out despite vigorous aeration. The palate is medium-bodied with a sweet, slightly candied entry, touches of marmalade and orange rind infusing the red fruit with a confit-like finish.

### 2022 Saint-Romain Le Jarron

Drinking Window: 2023 - 2033 Neal Martin, October 2023

The 2022 Saint-Romain Le Jarron is a step up from the Bourgagne Blanc with light yellow fruit and landin scents unfolding in the glass. The palate is vibrant on the entry with a fine bead of acidity, fresh and saline, with a limestone-tinged finish emanating from the calcareous soils. This should age well in bottle.

# 2022 Saint-Romain Perrière

Drinking Window: 2024 - 2034 Neal Martin, October 2023

The 2022 Saint-Romain Perrière is richer on the nose than the Le Jarron, with pineapple, light Anjou pear scents, and an underlying earthy note. The palate is well-balanced, with fine depth and grip matched by a keen line of acidity. Hints of pear once again intermix with citrus peel, just a subtle spiciness entering towards the finish. Fine.

# 2022 Saint-Romain Sous Roche

Color, Red

Drinking Window: 2025 - 2034 Neal Martin, October 2023

The 2022 Saint-Romain Sous Roche has an airy bouquet offering raspberry and cranberry fruit with touches of undergrowth coming through with aeration. The palate has a little chewiness on the entry, the tonnins here a little more pliant than the Beaune reds with a hint of white pepper towards the finish. Give it a year in bottle.
